5. JOHN<sup>3</sup> IRISH (John<sup>2</sup>, John<sup>1</sup>) b 1 May 1699 in LC, d there in July 1772. He was m 10 May 1720 in LC by Thomas Church, justice, to THANKFUL WILBORE, dau of Samuel and Mary (Potter) Wilbore, b 8 June 1700 in LC, d there about 1773.

His will, recorded in LC Probate book 2, page 235; made in 1773: "To wife best bed and furniture, my great Bible, half the household goods, free and clear. To my two sons David and Samuel they to provide food for my wife suitable to an aged woman. This to be void if she marry again To son Edward 60 silver Spanish dollars. I have a silver tankard which he gave me as a pledge for money borrowed. To sons Charles and Ichobod 14 Spanish silver dollars. To son Levi 1 English crown. To daus Mary Manchester and Thankful Cook 1 silver Spanish milled dollar each. To two sons David and Samuel my right in the 17th great lott, to eastward of ye great road, namely to David all eastward of ye wall that runneth across the lott, southward from John Irish's orchard, son of David, dec., which tract to land I have given him, to son Samuel to westward of said wall down to Miry Swamp so called. To above two sons the rest and remainder. Son David to be sole executor..."

6. JOHN<sup>4</sup> IRISH (David<sup>3</sup>, John<sup>2</sup>, John<sup>1</sup>) b 22 Feb 1708 in LC, d there in Jan 1782. He was m (1) 9 Apr 1732 in LC by Thomas Church Esq., to DEBORAH WOOD, dau of Thomas and Content (probably) Wood, b 17 Aug 1704 in LC. He m (2) ANNA (--). They lived in the old Irish place opposite the Friend's Meeting House.

His will, recorded in LC Probate, book 3, page 23, made 29 May 1772 and proved 5 Feb 1782: "To wife Anna improvement on easterly part of my homestead farm and southern most room in my house during her widowhood and until my dau Elizabeth comes to the age of 21. To s Thomas all wearing apparel and east end of homestead farm which I gave to my wife the improvement of, all my she making tools, my bench I made lasts upon with knife to same belonging. To son David the west end of my homestead
